£2.60	Achillea x huteri	A dense growing, silvery mound with a profusion of pure white flowers in summer.
£2.60	Achillea erba-rota ssp moschata	Alpine species with foliage like fine chamomile and short stems of white flowers in summer.

£2.60	Acinos alpinus	Alpine herb forming small mound. Lots purple-pink labiate flrs. in Summer. Dry scree/ sun.
£2.60	Aethionema armstrongii 'Warley Rose'	Low shrub of glaucous foliage topped by v. long display of dusky pink flrs. Sun baked position.
£2.60	Allium cernuum (light pink form)	Excellent rockery variety, only 8" high, with drooping pink umbels in late summer.
£3.20	Allium insubricum	Very special, slow to reach flwrg. size, dusky pink, thimble sized bells hang from 8" stems.
£2.60	Allium sikkimensis	Neat rockery species at only 7" with deep royal blue heads. One of very best for alpine gardens.
£2.60	Allium thunbergii	Last alpine to flower on Nursery, at only 6". Round, chunky pink globes, Oct – November.
£2.60	Anaphalis triplinervis 'Sommer Schnee'	Beautiful, silvery carpet of silky haired leaves and 4" stems white, Helichrysum-like flowers.
£2.60	Androsace carnea 'Brigantica'	Compact 'Thrift like' mound with short stems of white flowers in April. A classy, easy alpine.
£3.20	Anemone x seemannii	Beautiful, pale yellow hybrid, between A. ranunculoides and native wood anemone.
£3.20	Anemone nemorosa 'Leed's Variety'	Giant flowered form of native wood anemone. Vigorous grower, leafy soils in part shade.
£3.20	Anemone nemorosa 'Robinsoniana'	One of the largest flwrg. wood Anemones of spring. Lilac-blue blooms well into late April.
£3.20	Anemone nemorosa 'Royal Blue'	A rarely offered form of the Wood Anemone. Large blue flrs from April. Part shade/leafy soil
£2.60	Anemone nemorosa x 'Virescens'	Unusual sport. Ferny green bracts instead of flowers. Very decorative for shaded woodland.
£2.60	Anemone ranunculoides	A little carpeter for moist shade. Masses of buttercup yellow flrs, then delicate bronzy fol.
£2.60	Anemone rivularis	Plenty of white blooms when few plants have yet reached their peak. Mid summer.
£2.60	Antennaria dioica 'Rubra'	A superb combination. Red button flwrs. above silvery mat. Lovely over rocks and gravel.
£2.60	Anthyllus vulneraria 'Coccinea'	Vibrant, crimson pea flowers on radiating stems. Has long flowering habit.
£2.60	Aquilegia buergeriana 'Calimero'	Charming, dwarf species Aquilegia, with chocolate lanterns and cream cup inside. 5"
£2.60	Aquilegia caerulea 'Red Hobbit'	Crimson red spurred flowers with a striking white cup. Ht. 10" with several stems per plant.
£2.60	Aquilegia flabellata 'Rosea'	A beautiful miniature with soft, baby pink flowers and cream cup. Only 7" high.
£2.60	Aquilegia ottonis var Amalliae	Hardy alpine with light, sky blue leaves topped by fragrant light blue and cream flowers, 9"
£2.60	Arenaria balearica	Interesting texture on this close, film-like mat of green, for gravel beds. Tiny white flowers.
£2.60	Arenaria purpurascens	Close mat of needle-like foliage, peppered with pinky-red, star like flowers during spring.
£3.20	Arisaema jaquemontii	Collected Nepal '97 at high altitude. Green striped spathe, 18" at lower levels, 10" on Nsy!

£2.60	<i>Armeria juniperifolia</i> 'Bevan's Form'	Tight dome radiating many deep pink 'Thrift' flrs. over fairly long period. Great trough plant.
£2.60	<i>Armeria maritima</i> 'Vesuvius'	New Thrift with hot pink flowers over a long period. Darkest bronzy foliage.
£2.60	<i>Arum italicum</i>	The ideal woodland plant for ground cover in dry shade. Cream spathes in spring.
£2.60	<i>Asplenium trichomanes</i>	Makes ideal alpine garden fern, can be tucked into crevices vertically in shade or in troughs.
£2.60	<i>Astilbe chinensis pumila</i> 'Tiny Form'	Perfect 6" miniature of this species <i>Astilbe</i> , which we have long cultivated. V. uncommon
£2.60	<i>Astilbe crispa</i> 'Perkeo'	Variety with very short, stiff leaves and 6" spikes of radiant pink flowers.
£2.60	<i>Astilbe simplicifolia</i> 'Inshriach Pink'	Must be the best flowering dwarf <i>Astilbe</i> for alpine gardens. Many pink flrs, bronzy foliage.
£2.60	<i>Astilbe simplicifolia</i> 'Sprite'	One of the most popular of dwarf <i>Astilbes</i> , its shell pink blossoms are only 8" high. Stunning.
£2.60	<i>Aubretia</i> 'Stock Flowered Pink'	Delicate, soft pink flowers on this semi-double rockery classic.
£3.20	<i>Berberis corallina</i> 'Compacta'	A rarity, eventually reaching 30" in ten years. Heavily covered in tangerine flowers.
£2.60	<i>Calceolaria falklandica</i>	Tough species from that windswept Island. Good size flrs. for carpeting in damp shade.
£2.60	<i>Caltha palustris</i> 'Alba'	Himalayan form of our 'Marsh Marigold'. Large flrs, almost like xmas roses early as Mar.
£2.60	<i>Caltha palustris</i> 'Multiplex'	The well-known, fully double form of our native Marsh Marigold. Very low growing.
£2.60	<i>Caltha palustris</i> ssp minor	Tiny Marsh Marigold growing as rarity in Scottish Mnts. only 2" high. Likes moisture!
£2.60	<i>Campanula cochlearifolia</i> 'Alba'	Abundant white thimbles from mid to late summer. Gently threads its way through gravel.
£2.60	<i>Campanula cochlearifolia</i> 'Bavaria Blue'	Heavier flowering sport, which also has larger blue thimbles. An easy and tidy little alpine.
£2.60	<i>Campanula cochlearifolia</i> 'Summer Pearl'	New double flowered variety, of palest blue colour. Mid summer, likes full sun.
£2.60	<i>Campanula collina</i>	A plant of damp turf in Californian Mountains. Carpeter, with deepest blue bells in summer.
£2.60	<i>Campanula garganica</i> 'Dickson's Gold'	There couldn't possibly be a better gold leafed alpine! Contrasts well with the sky blue flowers
£2.60	<i>Campanula</i> 'Haylodgensis Alba'	Huge, semi-double white flowers over low growing mound. Long flowering period.
£2.60	<i>Campanula pulla</i>	A lush green mound, producing short stems of large violet bells throughout summer.
£2.60	<i>Cardamine heptaphylla</i>	Seldom seen beauty for the woodland bed. Lightly scented, cream flowers, approx. 2' high
£2.60	<i>Centaurea incana</i>	Silvery rosettes thread through gravel. Stemless white cornflowers from late May. Uncommon.

£2.60	<i>Centaureum scilloides</i>	Small, green hummock for poor, stony soil, with long display of soft pink flrs. on 1" stems.
£2.60	<i>Chaenorhinum glareosum</i>	Compact pad of fleshy leaves, short stems of pale lilac flrs over long period. Gritty soil.
£2.60	<i>Chaenorhinum origanifolium</i> 'Blue Dream'	Cheerful, easy alpine with lovely blue flowers, en masse, for most of season.
£2.60	<i>Chaiastophyllum oppositifolium</i>	A well-known alpine with succulent leaves and pendulous Laburnum-like chains.
£2.60	<i>Chrysanthemum</i> 'Haradjanii'	Silvery, fringed foliage, forming open mound 4" high. Small yellow button flowers. Full sun.
£2.60	<i>Chrysanthemum weyrichii</i>	G'cover with 7" stems of large pink Chrysanthus Showy, seldom seen Japanese alpine. Hardy.
£3.20	<i>Colchicum agrippinum</i>	Rare Turkish species, only 6". Characteristic chequered goblets of dusky rose colour.
£3.20	<i>Colchicum speciosum</i>	Autumn wouldn't be the same without the huge pink goblets thrusting through fallen leaves.
£2.60	<i>Commelina dianthifolia</i>	Hardy species from high alt. California. Small <i>Tradescantia</i> like flrs. of deepest royal blue. 9"
£3.20	<i>Convallaria majalis</i>	Sweetly scented Lily of the Valley for moist shade. Good ground cover for trouble spots.
£3.20	<i>Convallaria majalis</i> 'Bordeaux'	The giant Lily of the Valley, with good sized leaves and flowers, and the usual sweet scent.
£3.40	<i>Convallaria majalis</i> 'Rosea'	This is the lovely pale pink form of Lily of the Valley. Shows colour best in shade.
£2.60	<i>Cortusa pekingnensis</i>	Dainty pink bells hang, nodding from 7" stems. Like any <i>Primula</i> relative, enjoys moist shade.
£2.60	<i>Corydalis</i> x 'Heavenly Blue'	Special new hybrid, between <i>C. elata</i> and <i>C. flexuosa</i> . Shorter stems of strong, sky blue flrs.
£2.60	<i>Corydalis ochroleuca</i>	Closely related to <i>C. lutea</i> but doesn't seed around as much. Cream flrs. for 8 mths of year!
£3.20	<i>Cyclamen cilicium</i>	Autumn flwrg. and early enough when grown in sheltered woodland or in cold glasshouse.
£3.20	<i>Cyclamen coum</i>	Stunning leaf forms on hardy pre-Spring Cyc. Add leaf mould to moist soil. Pink/ white/reds.
£3.20	<i>Cyclamen hederifolium</i> 'White Cloud'	Pure silver leaves, with white flowers in autumn. Dramatic combination for shade.
£3.20	<i>Cyclamen hederifolium</i> 'Silver Cloud'	A special cultivar. Pure silver, unmarked leaves, pink flowers. Looks amazing in shade.
£3.20	<i>Cyclamen intaminatum</i>	Truly miniature, hardy species. Round glossy leaves and small white flrs. Seldom offered.
£3.20	<i>Cyclamen mirabile</i>	Autumn flwrg, hardy in sheltered woodland or may be enjoyed in cold glasshouse. Scented.
£3.50	<i>Cyclamen pseudibericum</i>	Rarely offered. Large magenta blooms late Feb. One of showiest species, best in cold g'house.
£3.50	<i>Cyclamen purpurascens</i>	Totally hardy, evergreen, summer flwrg. Very special species with scent of Lily of the Valley.
£2.60	<i>Cymbalaria globosa</i> 'Rosea'	Compact dome, studded all over with pink flowers through Summer. A RARE cultivar.

£2.60	<i>Cymbalaria hepaticifolia</i>	Rarely seen, with its marbled, leathery leaves, studded with cream, stemless flowers.
£2.60	<i>Dianthus arenarius forma nanum</i> 'Little Maiden'	Small compact cushion, ideal for troughs, etc. Short sprays white, ragged edged, fragrant flrs.
£2.60	<i>Dianthus alpinus</i> 'Inshriach Dazzler'	Well named rockery Pink, with most vivid shade of deep pink flowers.
£2.60	<i>Dianthus myrtinervis</i>	Lush green dome, radiating 3" stems deep pink flowers during spring.
£2.60	<i>Dianthus pavonius</i>	A classy, high alpine mound. Tiny leaves and large pink flowers.
£2.60	<i>Dierama pauciflora</i>	Evergreen, tough leaves, like ornamental grass, only 14" high. Bunches deep pink flrs. Hardy.
£2.60	<i>Disporopsis pernyi</i>	Flared white bells in leaf axils. <i>Polygonatum</i> relative, 10" high.
£3.20	<i>Disporum flavum</i>	Very rare. Large cream lockets, similar to <i>Dicentra</i> . Orange berries Autumn. Peat bed.16"
£3.50	<i>Disporum smilicinum</i> 'Flora Plena'	Very rare sport - took us many years to build stocks of. Small cream flrs, double row petals.
£2.60	<i>Disporum smilicinum</i> 'Variegata'	Elegant, slender leaves delicately striped with white. Green and white bells in spring.
£3.20	<i>Disporum smithii</i>	This woodlander produces low mound – cream lockets late Spring, lrg. yellow berries Autumn.
£2.60	<i>Dodecatheon meadia</i>	'Shooting Stars' for spring display in part shade. <i>Cyclamen</i> -like blooms in April.
£2.60	<i>Draba aizoides</i>	An easy and very early spring time alpine. Neat mound, sprays of bright yellow flrs. Feb-Mar.
£2.60	<i>Draba bruniifolia</i>	Beautiful, dense cushions of emerald green, with golden flowers, pre-spring.
£2.60	<i>Dracocephalum botryoides</i>	Really beautiful and delicate, true alpine. Softly haired leaves, close mat, long display lilac flrs.
£2.60	<i>Dryas x suendermannii</i>	German hybrid with large white flowers, grown for its floriferous habit and ease of cultivation.
£2.60	<i>Epilobium fleischeri</i>	For those who like the Willowherb flowers. This classy, high Swiss alpine is non-invasive.
£2.60	<i>Epimedium grandiflorum</i>	One of the best. Large white flrs. on thin stems. Graceful plant for a special place, in part shade.
£2.60	<i>Epimedium grandiflorum</i> 'Lilafee' (Lilac Fairy)	Violet flowers of good size. A superb hybrid of compact growth, only 8" high.
£2.60	<i>Epimedium youngianum</i> x 'Roseum'	Truly dainty miniature with hair thin stems and Pale pink flrs. New, elfin like fol. follow buds.
£2.60	<i>Epimedium x sulphureum</i> 'Cupreum'	Warm, coppery orange flowers above striking bronzy marbled foliage. Uncommon.
£2.60	<i>Epimedium youngianum niveum</i>	The most delicate of <i>Epimedium</i> species. Nodding white cups on hair thin stems.
£5.00	<i>Epipactis gigantea</i>	Rarely offered wholesale. Easy to place orchid with brown/orange winged flwrs. on 10" stems.

£2.60	<i>Eranthis cilicica</i>	Turkish species with finely cut, bronzed leaves. We grow an especially large flowered form.
£2.60	<i>Erigeron auranticus</i>	Emerald green, glossy leaves and stout stems of bright orange daisies.
£2.60	<i>Erigeron montanensis</i>	Long succession of lilac daisies held stemless above softly haired leaves. Easy, very showy.
£2.60	<i>Erinus alpinus</i> (Species)	The well-known 'Fairy Foxglove' for crevices and walls. Lots pale mauve flowers on 2" stems
£2.60	<i>Erinus alpinus</i> 'Alba'	Much slower growing, white sport of the 'Fairy Foxglove'. Requires good drainage and full sun
£2.60	<i>Erinus alpinus</i> 'Dr Hahnle'	The closest to a red cultivar yet raised – actually a vivid magenta over close green tufts.
£2.60	<i>Erodium variable</i> 'Album'	Like most <i>Erodiums</i> , a constant flowerer. Tiny stemless white blooms all season long. Troughs
£2.60	<i>Erodium variable</i> 'Candy'	Stunning new cultivar with deepest red flowers and long flowering period.
£2.60	<i>Erodium variable</i> 'Roseum'	Excellent trough plant, flowering for ages at ground level, throughout the season.
£2.60	<i>Felicia rosulata</i>	Hardy Himalayan species. Cornflower blue flowers with orange centres.
£3.20	<i>Fillipendula palmata</i> Dwarf Form	Ideal woodland or front of border plant. Pink flowers, approx. 9" in height.
£5.80	<i>Fritillaria camschatensis</i> Dwarf Form	Rarely offered, relic from Jack Drake alpine nsy. Japanese alpine, 9" high. Black flowers.
£3.20	<i>Gentiana acaulis</i>	Slow to grow (3 yrs) but well worth wait! Huge blue trumpets, tight mound glossy fol. in April.
£3.20	<i>Gentiana acaulis</i> 'Krumrey'	SPECIAL. A very free-flowering form from Germany. Large, deep blue flowers from May.
£2.60	<i>Gentiana cruciata</i>	Summer flowering, light blue narrow trumpets. Easy Gentian for sunny rockery. East Europe.
£3.20	<i>Geranium cinereum</i> 'Purple Pillow'	Strikingly dark, matched by darker foliage, also with a purplish cast. One of the best varieties.
£2.60	<i>Geranium cinereum</i> 'Signal'	Vibrant, reddish-pink flrs. from May-late summer, a fairly new cultivar. Good drainage.
£3.20	<i>Geranium cinereum</i> 'Splendens'	Quite unique shade of vivid pink on large flowers produced over long period. Height 4".
£2.60	<i>Geranium dalmaticum</i> 'Album'	Very special, slow to produce. Remains small with good sized white flowers.
£2.60	<i>Geranium dalmaticum</i> 'Croftlea'	We're first to promote and propagate this free flowering, carpeting form, given by D. Hutton.
£2.60	<i>Geranium macrorrhizum</i> 'Snow Sprite'	Low, compact carpet, not too vigorous. Long display snow white flowers. Approx. 7"x 12"
£2.60	<i>Geranium orientalitibeticum</i>	A natural variegation to foliage. Dusky pink flrs. late summer. Good groundcover, ht. 3"
£2.60	<i>Geranium renardii</i>	Round, sage like leaves, and 6" stems of large cream flrs, deeply veined in grey. Himalayas.

£2.60	Geranium sanguineum 'Striatum'	Very compact, free flowering in shade of soft, light pink. Easy Geranium for almost any soil.
£2.60	Geranium subcaulescens (species)	The standard form as seen in European Alps. Magenta flowers with dark central zone.
£2.60	Geum triflorum campanulatum	Ground hugging species, with ferny foliage. 4" stems, each with 3 nodding apricot bells. U.S.A
£3.50	Gypsophila aretioides <b>7cm pot</b>	For alpine house or sunny trough. Forms iron hard cushion, very slow growing. SPECIAL.
£2.60	Gypsophila cerastoides	Close mat, hidden by the abundant white flowers. Makes a good trough plant.
£2.60	Gypsophila cerastoides 'Rosy stripe'	Collected in China not so long ago, much slower growing with white fls, pink veining.
£2.60	Gypsophila repens 'Dorothy Teacher'	An old cultivar, prized for free-flowering habit. With light pink blooms.
£2.60	Gypsophila 'Rosenschleier'	Abundance of double pink flowers, for cascading over rocks from May onwards.
£2.60	Gypsophila repens 'Rosea'	Reliable, cascading alpine for providing sheets of light pink flowers all summer.
£2.60	Gypsophila tenuifolius	Excellent trough plant. Close grass-like cushion with many pale pink flowers in spring. Easy.
£3.50	Haberlea rhodopensis	Special alpine for north facing, full shade. Plant between rocks at angle. Mauve flrs. in spring.
£2.60	Happlopapaus reuppellii	Although leaves are Dandelion-like, flowers produced are like large stemless gold Gazanias.
£2.60	Hebe popplewellii	Small, bronzy globe of a shrub, dense growth forming a ball, some 4" x 6". Uncommon.
£2.60	Hebe youngii 'Carl Teschner'	Lovely, dense shrublet with masses of flowers in spring. THE TRUE PLANT!
£3.20	Helleborus foetidus 'Wester Flisk'	Short growing, Scottish hybrid. Red stems and green bells edged in claret. March – May.
£3.20	Hepatica nobilis Alba	Pure white form of this popular, early spring woodlander. Flowers above unmarked leaves.
£3.20	Hepatica nobilis (Dusky Pink)	Selected for its soft lilac/pink shade, a welcome colour break so early in the Spring.
£3.20	Hepatica nobilis 'Pyrenean Marbles'	Stunning, large white flowers above Cyclamen-like, marbled fol. Last of the nobilis to flower.
£2.60	Heuchera pulchella	Dainty mound producing many red stems of soft pink flowers. High regions of Rocky Mts.
£2.60	Hosta 'Golden Tiara'	Striking, gold variegation on this neat, small Hosta with deep mauve flowers. A.G.M.
£2.60	Hypericum cerastoides	Classy Turkish species forming mats with huge lemon blooms and silvery grey foliage.
£2.60	Iberis sempervirens 'Little Gem'	The toughest and best flowering of the dwarf, alpine candy tufts. Top class, long-lived plant.
£2.60	Inula orientalis 'Grandiflora'	A neat woodlander from Himalayas, only 10" high, with large, orange Calendula-like flowers.
£3.20	Ipheion uniflorum	Tufts of grass-like stems produce long spring

	'Charlotte Bishop'	display of dusky pink stars. Very special.
£2.60	Iris humilis <b>7cm pot</b>	The smallest Iris we grow – only 3" high. Has canary yellow flowers. Ideal trough plant.
£3.20	Iris innominata Dwarf Form	A cream flowered seedling, selected on the nursery, with delicate, pink veining. 6" high.
£2.60	Iris pumila 'Brassie'	Good rockery bearded Iris, with brassy gold coloured flowers. Approx. 8" high.
£2.60	Iris pumila 'Cherry Garden'	For those who like dark flowers, this 8" Iris has large, aubergine coloured blooms in spring.
£3.20	Iris pumila 'The Gingerbread Man'	Very rare dwarf bearded Iris. Brown flrs, violet beard.
£2.60	Iris pumila 'Knick-knack'	A rare and sought after hybrid. White flowers with a violet picotee edge to the petals.
£2.60	Iris pumila 'Little Shadow'	The smallest pumila we have seen, at only 6" in height. Dark violet flrs, black shadowy falls.
£2.60	Iris reticulata 'Katherine Hodgkin' (2 bulbs)	In previous years, almost flowering before the season starts! Really lovely little plant.
£2.60	Iris setosa Dwarf form	Easy dwarf Iris for relatively moist soil. This form approx. 8" Blue flowers, gold veining.
£2.60	Leontopodium soulei 'Mignon'	Close, mat forming sport of the curious looking Edelweiss.
£2.60	Leucojum aestivum 'Gravetye Giant' <b>Bare root</b>	Bold clump of strap leaves, topped with good sized Snowdrop like bells in late spring.
£3.20	Leucojum vernum <b>Bare root</b>	Giant snowdrop relative. 8" stems topped by huge white bells from February.
£2.60	Lewisia cotyledon 'Regenbogen'	Stunning vibrant colours - orange to deep pink. Even some semi-dbl. flwr'd on this named strain
£2.60	Lewisia cotyledon x 'Little Plum'	German hybrid, of hardy constitution. Lovely, pale raspberry colour flrs. over a long period.
£2.60	Limonium speciosum 'Blue Diamond'	An alpine Statice for raised beds in sun. 8" papery flowers of pale violet. Evergreen fol.
£3.20	Lithodora diffusa 'Blue Star'	Perhaps not the alpine purist's choice, but this Lithospermum has white flrs, blue star in centre
£2.60	Lunaria rediviva	Unfortunately, seldom seen. Long lived, early flowering with fragrant white blooms. 3' high.
£2.60	Lychnis alpina	The little pink alpine Catch-fly, for rock crevices. Short stems of pale pink flowers.
£2.60	Lychnis alpina 'Snow Flurry'	White form of the alpine Catch-fly. Likes good drainage.
£2.60	Lysimachia japonica minutissima	Seldom seen Japanese miniature. Low cushion studded with tiny yellow flrs. late summer-aut.
£2.60	Maianthemum bifolium	Dwarf woodland 'May Lily' white flr. spikes, and small Hosta like leaves. Rare U.K. native.
£4.20	Meconopsis quintuplinervia	Reginald Farrar's 'Harebell Poppy' for shady cool spots, beside Ericaceous and woodlanders.
£2.60	Mimulus x burnettii	The hardiest of all Mimulus. Long lived hybrid, with hot orange blooms all summer. Special.
