#### ALPINE PLANTS 8 - 9CM SQUARE POTS

£3.00	Achillea x 'King Edward'	First rate alpine, flowering for ages with soft primrose yellow blooms. Only 4" high.
£4.00	Achillea ageratifolia	Close, silvery pad with 3" stems of large, white flowers. Trough or scree in full sun. Uncommon.
£4.00	Adiantum venustum	Totally hardy Maidenhair Fern, from Himalayas. Enjoys cool, shady spot, with leafy compost.
£4.00	Adonis brevistyla (syn davidii)	Uncommon. Large, glistening white daisies with an ice-blue reverse, giving crystal-like effect.
£3.50	Allium acuminatum	North American species, approx. 7" high, with umbels of lrg. reddish-pink flowers. Full sun.
£4.50	Allium beesianum	The true species, rarely seen. 8" stems, topped with nodding heads of large sky blue bells.
£3.50	Allium cyaneum	Close tuft of needle thin leaves, topped by many small Gentian blue heads in summer. Ht. 7"
£4.00	Allium cernnum 'Dwarf White'	Wonderful, new introduction. Free flowering, at Only 7" high. Superior to pink forms.
£4.00	Allium insubricum	Very special, slow to reach flwrg. size, dusky pink, thimble sized bells hang from 8" stems.
£3.50	Allium kokanicum	Slender arching stems to 8" high, support round, nodding, dusky pink heads. Uncommon.
£3.50	Allium sikkimensis	Neat rockery species at only 7" with deep royal blue heads. One of very best for alpine gardens.
£3.50	Allium thunbergii	Last alpine to flower on Nursery, at only 6". Round, pink globes, Oct – November. Japan.
£3.50	Allium wallichianum	Attractive Himalayan species, growing to 16" With deep purple nodding umbels, mid summer.
£3.50	Androsace albana	Seldom seen species, forming large rosette of linear leaves. Cream-shell pink flowers. Ht. 5"
£3.50	Androsace carnea 'Rosea'	Forming neat cushion with masses of pale pink flrs. in march. Ideal trough plant for full sun.
£3.50	Androsace lanuginosa	Silvery haired rosettes, form gentle cascade ending in light pink flowers in mid summer.
£3.50	Androsace strigillosa	Large rosette at ground level, with stems 5-6" high. Topped with many pale pink flowers.
£3.00	Androsace studiosorum	A good form, with large pink flowers in June. Easy alpine for crevice gardens or troughs.
£4.00	Anemone nemorosa 'Blue Bonnet'	Seldom offered selection, mid blue flowers pre spring. Slow growing special for shade.
£4.00	Anemone nemorosa 'Flore Pleno'	Finer leaved and slower growing than A. Vestal. Flowers are more or less fully double centred.
£4.00	Anemone nemorosa 'Royal Blue'	Large flowers of a good strong blue. A dramatic addition for leafy shade. Slow spreader.
£4.00	Anemone x lipsiensis (syn seemannii)	Beautiful, pale yellow hybrid, between A. ranunculoides and native wood anemone.
£4.00	Anemone nemorosa x 'Vestal'	Double pom-pom centres on this classic w/land Anemone. Mid-late spring, Free flwrg. Special.

£4.00	Anemone nemorosa x 'Virescens'	Unusual sport. Ferny green bracts instead of flowers. Very decorative for shaded woodland.
£4.00	Anemone sylvestris 'Flore Pleno'	Quite a rare item. Flowers so double, they form almost a pom-pom. Groundcover at only 4" ht.
£4.00	Anemone trullifolia	Good sized flowers of rich blue, late spring, 3" high. Ours are 3-4 yr. old plants. Himalayas.
£3.50	Antennaria dioica 'Rubra'	A superb combination. Red button flwrs. above silvery mat. Lovely over rocks and gravel.
£3.50	Aquilegia bertolonii	The tiniest Aquilegia of Italian Alps. 2" hair thin stems, with large, deep blue flowers. For scree.
£3.00	Aquilegia buergeriana 'Calimero'	Charming, dwarf species Aquilegia, with chocolate lanterns and cream cup inside. 5"
£3.00	Aquilegia ottonis ssp amaliae	Dwarf, fragrant species from Greece, only 5" ht. Flowers of soft, pale blue with white central cup.
£3.50	Aquilegia vulgaris 'Green Apples'	Quite unique, with double, apple green blooms early summer. Ideal for borders. Approx. 18"
£3.00	Arabis blepharophylla 'Spring Charm'	We rigourously select, to maintain the true, reddish-pink that this cultivar is known for.
£3.00	Arabis caucasica 'Pixie Cream'	Classy, compact dome of olive green rosettes, covered in lots of cream flrs. Suits crevice. Sun.
£3.50	Arenaria festucoides	A close, grassy mat from the Himalayas, with stemless white flowers. Best slightly moist.
£3.00	Arenaria montana 'Avalanche'	Recently introduced form, of close compact habit producing sheet of white blooms in spring.
£3.50	Armeria juniperifolia 'Alba'	One of the easiest and best trough plants. Tight mound, pure white Thrift flrs. in early spring.
£3.50	Armeria juniperifolia 'Bevan's Form'	Tight dome radiating many deep pink 'Thrift' flrs. over fairly long period. Great trough plant.
£3.50	Arum italicum 'Chameleon'	Excellent woodlander, with beautifully marked leaves splashed with cream. Spathe, also cream.
£3.50	Asperula nitida	Thin, needle-like leaves, on this bluish tinged cushion, hidden below mass of pale pink flowers
£3.00	Aster alpinus 'Dark Beauty'	Large, deep violet blue daisies on 6" stems. Enjoys perfect drainage in full sun. Eur. Alps.
£3.50	Astilbe chinensis pumila 'Tiny Form'	Perfect 6" miniature of this species Astilbe, which we have long cultivated. V. uncommon
£3.50	Astilbe crispa 'Perkeo'	Japanese species with very short, stiff leaves and 6" spikes of radiant pink flowers.
£4.00	Astilbe simplicifolia 'Inshriach Pink'	A Scottish hybrid of superior flowering habit. Many pink flowers above bronzy foliage. Ht. 12"
£3.50	Aubretia 'Bressingham Red'	The best red to date of this easy, yet valuable addition to rockery. Flowers in spring.
£3.50	Aubrieta 'Valerie'	Bright gold variegation to the compact rosettes. Light lavender blue flowers. Uncommon.
£3.50	Aubrieta variegata 'Nana'	A non-cascading cultivar, forming close cushion with long display of lavender flowers. Mar-Jun.
£4.00	Bergenia cordifolia 'Eroica'	Useful, smaller growing plant for the alpine garden. Good red winter colour, red-purple flrs.
£4.00	Bergenia cordifolia 'Overture'	Compact cultivar, with good red winter colour. Flowers are a purplish-red colour. Late spring.

£3.50	Brimeura amethystina	Lilliputian hyacinth with elfin bells of blue, rarely white, on arching 6" stems. E.U. Alps.
£3.50	Bulbinella hookeri	Bronzy strap-like foliage. 1' high stems with 'Pokers' of old gold colour. Likes moisture.
£3.50	Calceolaria falklandica	Tough species from that windswept Island. Good size flowers for carpeting in damp shade.
£3.50	Caltha palustris ssp minor	Tiny Marsh Marigold growing as rarity in Scottish Mnts. only 2" high. Likes moisture!
£3.50	Campanula garganica 'Dickson's Gold'	There couldn't possibly be a better gold leafed alpine! Contrasts well with the sky blue flowers
£3.50	Campanula nitida 'Alba'	Attractive, glossy evergreen rosettes, on compact mound. Huge white, waxy saucers, in summer.
£4.00	Cardamine heptaphylla	Seldom seen beauty for the woodland bed. Lightly scented, cream flowers, approx. 2' high
£4.00	Cardamine pentaphylla	Large dissected leaves emerge after a show of pink trumpets, pre spring. 8" high, woodland.
£4.00	Cardamine kitaibellia (syn enneaphylla)	Beautiful cream lockets hang above narrow fingered foliage, from March. Woodlander. 7".
£3.50	Cardamine pratensis 'Flora Plena'	Showy, double pink sport of the native Cuckoo Flower, for moist soil. No bad vices.
£3.00	Cardamine trifolium	Leathery, glossy leaves at ground level. 3" high stems of white flowers from March – April.
£3.50	Cardamine waldsteinii	An uncommon woodland species forming low mat of leaves and short sprays of lg. white flrs.
£4.00	Centaurea montana 'Alba'	Pure white flowers on 18" stems, within silvery grey leaves. Suits mid-front border.
£3.00	Chrysanthemum weyrichii	G'cover with 7" stems of large pink Chrysanth. Showy, seldom seen Japanese alpine. Hardy.
£3.00	Chrysosplenium davidianum	The superior Chinese species, with large yellow flowers. Carpeter for woodland, over long period
£4.00	Clematis alpina 'Alba'	The seldom seen pure white version. Suitable for scrambling through smaller trees or shrubs.
£4.00	Clematis x petrei 'Lunar Lass'	Gently cascading hybrid, with greenish-yellow small flowers along thin stems. Good pot var.
£4.00	Clematis marmoraria	Forming an open cushion of parsley-like foliage. Many creamy yellow blooms. Trough or scree.
£4.00	Colchicum agrippinum	Fine Turkish species, only 6". Characteristic chequered goblets of dusky rose colour.
£4.00	Colchicum speciosum	Autumn wouldn't be the same without the huge pink goblets thrusting through fallen leaves.
£4.50	Colchicum speciosum 'Album'	Stunning. Huge white goblets in early autumn. Our clone builds up reasonably quickly.
£3.50	Commelina dianthifolia	Hardy species from high alt. California. Small Tradescantia like flrs. of deepest royal blue. 9"
£4.00	Convallaria majalis 'Albostrata'	Very slow growing, with thin gold striations to the leaf. A special and well behaved woodlander.
£4.00	Convallaria majalis 'Rosea'	The pink Lily of the Valley, slower growing than species type. Colour deepens as plant matures.
£4.00	Cyclamen cilicium	Flowering period follows C. hederifolium in autumn, also less robust. Shades of pink-white.

£4.00	Cyclamen coum	Stunning leaf forms on hardy pre-Spring Cyc. Add leaf mould to moist soil. Pink/ white/reds.
£4.00	Cyclamen coum BSBE 518 Form 2	Cyclamen Soc. field trip introduction. Silvered fol, narrow green central zone. Pink flrs.Feb/May
£4.00	Cyclamen coum 'Nyman's Strain'	Most beautiful of all coum hybrids. Mostly silver foliage, with reddish/magenta flowers.
£4.00	Cyclamen coum 'Tile Barn Elizabeth'	Free-flowering, pure silver leafed hybrid. Flrs. are deep pink, wth paler picottee edge. Early.

£4.00	Cyclamen hederifolium Long Leaf form	Special seedlings of our finest saggitate, almost aroid, shaped leaves. Colours vary, whites/pinks.
£4.00	Cyclamen hederifolium 'Silver Cloud'	A special cultivar. Pure silver, unmarked leaves, pink flowers. Looks amazing in shade.
£4.00	Cyclamen hederifolium 'White Cloud'	Pure silver leaves, with white flowers in autumn. Dramatic combination for shade.
£4.00	Cyclamen intaminatum 8cm	Truly miniature, hardy species. Round glossy leaves and small white flrs. Seldom offered.
£4.50	Cyclamen libanoticum	Rare species, from Mts. of the Lebanon. Hardy in cold glasshouse. Lrg. white flwrs, red blotch.
£4.50	Cyclamen pseudibericum 8cm	Rarely offered. Large magenta blooms late Feb. One of showiest species, best in cold g'house.
£5.00	Cyclamen purpurascens	Totally hardy, evergreen, summer flwrg. Very special species with scent of Lily of the Valley.
£3.00	Delosperma congesta	Dense mound of glossy rosettes, producing stemless, acid yellow Livingston Daisies.
£3.00	Delosperma nubigena	Hardest of all Livingston Daisies. Long-lived mat with golden flowers. Poorest soils suit.
£3.50	Delphinium cashmerianum	Not to be confused with the short-lived species. Stocky plant, 16" high. Large violet, hooded flrs.
£3.50	Dianthus 'Annette'	Striking blue foliage, on this compact dome. 2" stems semi double, blood red flowers. Scented.
£3.50	Dianthus erinaceus alpinus	The 'Hedgehog' Dianthus, forming a close, prickly cushion with short stems of pink flrs.
£3.50	Dianthus arenarius 'Little Maiden'	Small compact cushion, ideal for troughs, etc. Short sprays white, ragged edged, fragrant flrs.
£3.50	Dianthus alpinus 'Inshriach Dazzler'	Well named rockery Pink, with most vivid shade of deep pink flowers.
£3.00	Dianthus 'La Bourboulle'	Close hummock of blue-green leaves with short stems of highly fragrant pink flowers.
£3.00	Dianthus 'Nywood's Cream'	One of the best compact alpine hybrids for scent. Short stems of cream flowers in summer.
£3.50	Dianthus pavonius	A wonderful species for rock garden. Ground hugging, smothered in deep pink flowers. Alps.
£3.50	Dianthus 'Rosebud'	A perpetually flowering, and scented miniature, with semi double, rose pink blooms. Only 4".
£4.00	Dianthus 'Whatfield Magenta'	Neat mound of attractive blue foliage, a dramatic contrast to the strong magenta flowers
£3.00	Dicentra cucularia	Finely dissected, smoky grey foliage, with 4" stems of white lockets in early spring.

£3.50	Dicentra eximea 'Stuart Boothman'	The true plant. Dwarf in stature, with smoky blue dissected foliage and ruby red lockets. Part shade
£4.00	Dicentra formosa 'Langtrees'	Smoky grey foliage of compact habit, producing pure white lockets on 10" stems. Tidy plant.
£3.50	Digitalis ferrugina	Perennial Foxglove species, with broad emerald green leaves and spikes of bronzy blooms. 3'
£4.00	Disporum smithii	Pale yellow lockets, produced en masse in spring followed by lrg. orange berries in autumn. Ht. 9"
£3.50	Dodecatheon meadia	'Shooting Stars' for spring display in part shade. Cyclamen-like blooms in April.
£3.00	Draba aizoides	An easy and very early spring time alpine. Neat mound, sprays of bright yellow flrs. Feb-Mar.
£4.00	Dryas octopetala	A good, free flowering clone of the native Mountain Avens. Enjoys lime, but not too dry.
£4.00	Dryas x suendermannii	German hybrid with large white flowers, grown for its floriferous habit and ease of cultivation.
£4.00	Epimedium grandiflorum 'Lilafee' (Lilac Fairy)	Violet flowers in abundance. A superb hybrid of compact growth, only 8" high.
£4.00	Epimedium x youngianum niveum	The most delicate of Epimedium species. Nodding white cups on hair thin stems.
£3.50	Erigeron glaucus	This clone of the species type is of compact, less robust habit. Long display of mauve daisies.
£3.50	Erigeron montanensis	Long succession of lilac daisies, held stemless above softly haired, tufted mound. Suits crevice.
£3.00	Erigeron pinnatisectus	Softly haired, slender leaves forming neat, tufted alpine. Summer long display of lilac daisies.
£3.00	Erodium pelargoniflorum	An abundance of white flowers, with soft pink blotches and large leaves. Full sun, gritty soil.
£3.50	Erodium chrysanthum 'Pale pink form'	Delicate, ferny foliage of silvery-green, producing a long display of pale pink 'cups'
£3.00	Felicia rosulata	Hardy Himalayan species. Cornflower blue flowers with orange centres. Carpeter.
£3.00	Festuca 'Golden Toupe'	Slow growing and small in stature, fine needles of pure golden yellow. Would suit trough.
£3.50	Ficaria verna 'Cuprea'	Well behaved Celandine, producing bright coppery-orange blooms in early spring. Moisture
£4.00	Ficaria verna 'Double Cream'	No fear of this seeding around! Sterile, large fully double, buff/cream flowers in spring.
£3.50	Ficaria verna 'Primrose'	A really showy Celandine, non-invasive with minimal foliage and huge creamy yellow flrs.
£8.00	Fritillaria camschatensis aurea	The yellow species type, flowering at 10" high, easy in moist shade. Seldom offered.
£7.00	Fritillaria camschatensis Dwarf Form	Rarely offered, relic from Jack Drake nsy. This is the Japanese alpine form, 6-8" high. Jet black
£4.00	Gentiana acaulis 'Krumrey'	SPECIAL. A very free-flowering form from Germany. Large, deep blue flowers from May.
£4.00	Gentiana acaulis 'Maximus'	Special. Simply huge, deep blue trumpets on this reliable flwrg. cultivar. Forms good sized mat.
£3.50	Gentiana verna 'Angulosa'	The free flowering and easier to cultivate form of the beautiful Star Gentian of the European Alps.

£3.50	Geranium renardii	Round, sage like leaves, and 6” stems of large cream flrs, deeply veined in grey. Himalayas.
£3.50	Geum triflorum campanulatum	Ground hugging species, with ferny foliage. 4” stems, each with 3 nodding apricot bells. U.S.A
£4.00	Gypsophila aretioides	For alpine house or sunny trough – covered in winter. Forms iron hard cushion, very slow.
£3.50	Gypsophila cerastoides	Close mat, hidden by the abundant white flowers. Ideal for hugging rock formation.
£3.50	Gypsophila tenuifolius	Close grass-like cushion, with many pale pink flowers all summer. Neat dome for rockery.
£4.00	Haquetia epipactis	Yellow button flower, with large green sepals early Spring. Woodlander for moist shade. Alps
£3.50	Hebe buchanani minor	Beautiful, compact mound, only 6” high. A worthwhile alpine shrublet. White flowers. May.
£4.00	Hebe tetrastricha	Dwarf, whipcord stems, topped with white flrs. in summer. Seldom seen, worthy species.
£3.50	Helianthemum ‘Ben Nevis’	Tough Scottish hybrid of ground-hugging habit. Long display burning orange flwrs. Uncommon.
£4.00	Hepatica nobilis Alba	Pure white form of this popular, early spring woodlander. Flowers above unmarked leaves.
£4.00	Hepatica nobilis (Violet Blue)	This form we grow is from plants obtained with the darkest violet shade imaginable.
£4.00	Hepatica nobilis (Dusky Pink)	Selected for its soft lilac/pink shade, a welcome colour break, also a free flowering clone.
£4.50	Hepatica nobilis Marbled/pink	Beautiful, dusky pink flowers sit above attractively marked foliage. Stays evergreen.
£4.00	Hepatica nobilis ‘Pyrenean Marbles’	Stunning, large white flowers above Cyclamen-like, marbled fol. Last of the nobilis to flower.
£4.50	Hepatica transsilvanica ‘Blue Eyes’	A sterile meadia type, with sky blue petals and attractive violet eye. A vigorous clone.
£3.50	Heuchera grossularifolia	Small, deep green leaves hug compost, like a cushion. Short spikes of cream flowers. Late.
£4.00	Hosta ‘Blue Mouse Ears’	Ideal for shady troughs, etc. Rounded blue leaves with deep lilac, good sized flowers. Ht. 3”
£4.00	Hosta kikutii var yakusimensis	A mere pad of tiny leaves, sending up 1” stems of large, lilac flowers. Quite uncommon.
£3.50	Hosta venusta	Dark green leaves at ground level, stems rise to 10”. Deep violet flowers in summer. From Japan
£4.00	Hypericum olympicum ‘Minus’	Beautiful, rounded evergreen shrub, perpetually flowering from early summer. Yellow flowers.
£3.00	Ipheion uniflorum ‘Charlotte Bishop’	Tufts of grass-like stems produce long spring display of dusky pink stars. Very special.
£4.00	Iris forestii Black Form	A rare form, of vastly slower growing habit. Blackish-purple blooms. Forms small clump.
£3.50	Iris pumila ‘Cherry Garden’	For those who like dark flowers, this 8” Iris has large, aubergine coloured blooms in spring.
£3.50	Iris pumila ‘Knick-knack’	A ‘must have’ plant. White flowers with a violet picotee edge to the petals.
£4.00	Iris x intermedia ‘The Gingerbread Man’	Unusual, dwarf bearded Iris. Brown flowers with violet beard. Ht. 10”. Full sun.

£3.50	Iris suavaolens	Tiny species from the Caucasus. Brass coloured, bearded Iris flowers, only 3” high.
£4.00	Iris setosa Dwarf form	Easy to please, free flwrg. dwarf Iris. Suits small rockery. Blue flowers, gold veining. Approx.8”
£3.50	Leontopodium alpinum ‘Matterhorn’	Forming neat mound, with many stems of huge, soft grey flowers. A sound perennial cultivar.
£4.00	Leucojum vernum	Giant Snowdrop relative. 8” stems topped by huge white bells from February. Moisture.
£4.50	Leucojum vernum ‘Carpathicum’	Grown from divisions of our best yellow tipped bulbs. Less vigorous than the greens. Moisture,
£3.50	Lewisia nevadensis ‘Rosea’	Soft pink flowers, held in heart of narrow leaves, early summer. Ideal pot plant for cold g/house.
£3.50	Limonium speciosum ‘Blue Diamond’	An alpine Statice for raised beds in sun. 10” papery flowers of pale violet. Evergreen foliage
£4.50	Linnaea borealis	Named after Carl Linneus, the native woodland ‘Twinflower’ Hair thin stems, pale pink bells.
£3.00	Lychnis alpina	Rounded heads of rosy pink, for rock crevices. Short stems above neat, Thrift-like mound.
£3.50	Lysimachia japonica minutissima	Japanese species forming neat pad, studded with tiny yellow flowers. Non-invasive. May-Aug.
£4.00	Maianthemum bifolium var Yakushimanum	This tiny species from Japan carpets troughs and shady areas under shrubs. Slow, non-invasive.
£4.00	Meconopsis baileyi ‘Alba’	Really beautiful large flowered white form of the Himalayan Blue Poppy. Boss of golden stamens.
£4.00	Meconopsis x ‘Lingholm’	Our plants originate from Lingholm Garden. Showing marked vigour and multi-crown habit.
£4.00	Meconopsis paniculata	Always popular for its chandeliers of yellow poppies in early summer. Ex- Nepalese coll.
£5.50	Meconopsis quintuplinervia	Reginald Farrar’s ‘Harebell Poppy’ for shady, cool spots. Enjoys moist, leafy soil in shade.
£4.00	Mertensia maritima	Rare Scottish native to Outer Hebrides. Sky blue, leaves, small thimble flowers. Sandy soil in sun.
£3.50	Morina longifolia	Prickly, Thistle-like foliage, with striking spikes of late, pink & white labiate flowers. Ht. 16”
£3.50	Muscari aucheri ‘Ocean Magic’ 3 bulbs	One of the ‘new look’ well behaved grape Hyacinths. Bright blue, graduating to white
£4.00	Muscari ‘Pink Sunrise’	A grape Hyacinth, of soft pink colour, beautiful in pots with cream and blue Primroses.
£3.50	Narcissus ‘Elka’ 2 bulbs	Dwarf, trumpet Narcissus, starts as palest yellow, opening fully to pure white. Ht. 8”.

£6.00	Phyllodoce caerulea ' <i>Wm Buchanan's peach seedling</i> '	Very rare hybrid, selected by famous plantsman, Wm. Buchanan. Pinky-peach tink to bells.
£6.00	Phyllodoce caerulea Japanese Form	Ideal trough plant, this Japanese form is lower growing and heavier flowering than species type.
